Dirk Gabriel

Kennel: von Quartier Latin

Joined the SV in 1980 South German Vice Champion in 2008

I started breeding under my kennel name, "vom Quartier Latin" in 1986. Our first litter produced Aic vom Quartier Latin and was a world Championship contender.

I am fortunate to have handled a lot of VA and Sieger/Siegerin at the German Sieger all breeds shows such as Nero vom Hirschel, Ungana von der Wienerau, Orna von der Steinhagerquelle, Cimbo von der Burg Reichenstein and so on.

I have also had success with my own dogs such as V7 Landos vom Quartier Latin, VA1 (USA) Maffey vom Quartier Latin and V2 Filou vom Quartier Latin.

I then went on to become a conformation judge in 2006 and then a Kormeister in 2012.

I judged the Young Male Class at the German Sieger Show in 2016.

Jochen Prall

Jochen Prall became a member of the SV in 1987. In his life he has trained many German Shepherds to Schutzhund titles and competed often at all levels of trials.

Jochen Prall was also an official helper for protection work for the SV from 1999 to 2013. During this time, he was a helper at 3 German Sieger shows, 1 BSP, 1 DJJM and a lot of other competitions and events.

He has been a registered conformation judge with the SV since 2015. He breeds under his kennel name "von der Liebeswarte", which has been registered with the SV since 1945. - Trying to get our German Shepherd "back on the street" as a family dog
- Absolutely no overtyping in terms of heads, lips and hindquarters
- All dogs from my breeding go back to "Sandra vom Wildsteiger Land", which we got from Martin Göbl in July 1989 as a foster dog at the age of five days
- Proud to have bred a dog like "Remo" through two parents who are also called "vom Fichtenschlag" and the father was an absolutely "unknown" with SG46 in the JHKLR of the BSZS 2006

Breeding group competition:

- For me it has been the highlight of the BSZS for many years
- Only in this competition can a breeder present the overall results of his breeding.
- A broad genetic material, especially on the female side, is much more important to me than individual "runaways", which can be impressively demonstrated in the breeding group competition.
